There is already a local.cf file in the SA\ruleset subdirectory of the installation.

> Also I believe everytime I've installed a NST update, the
> local.cf file is replaced. Is that correct.

The local.cf file is where the SpamAssassin settings are stored. When updating to a new version, this file is one of the few files that is NOT replaced.

Be careful, however, if you edit the local.cf file with a text editor, and run the SpamAssassin filter settings dialog at the same time. For example, it can happen that you inadvertently overwrite changes you just made with the text editor by committing changes from the settings dialog.
