I changed S1 to have both local ip address and gave S2 the internet IP on one NIC. I then setup NST(No Spam Today) to send everything to port 25 on S1. MS Outlook 2002 and before work fine but when you try to use Outlook 2003 it said that it cant find the path and i need to first connect to the exchange server. Before I changed anything 2003 was working
