At one time, we had *@msn.com in our extensive whitelist, which contains just under 500 entries. *@msn.com was erroneous, and I removed it. But now anything@msnc.com is flagged as being in the whitelist. I did the following:

Stop NST Service

Delete local.cf from the sa\ruleset directory

Run NST admin, add settings again, including cut and paste whitelist from text editor (search in text editor shows no msn.com in it at all)

Start NST Service, conduct test.

Results of test are in header below.
