Set the incoming IP of NST to this new address (port 25) and set the outgoing server to the previously used IP (port 25).
Make sure that your firewall delivers incoming SMTP traffic to the newly created IP.

Also, I am now getting a maximum number of licensed recipient mail addresses exceeded error. I only really use one address as this is for personal use. All mail going to other address is spam. How do I resolve this?

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If you enter in your address in the SMTP Proxy configuration, anything else should bounce with a 550 error without making it into the IIS queue. Therefore, your badmail folder won't fill up any more.

The badmail folder is one of the caveats of Microsoft SMTP implementation. Only in Exchange 2003 can you set the server to simply reject bad mail with a 550 error instead of processing it.

If it still fills up, create and schedule a batch file to clean it every day or so. Or, use this tool:
