You should backup

- the nospamtoday.cf file,
- the local.cf file in the sa\ruleset subdirectory (and any other rules files you changed or added manually)
- the complete db subdirectory (if you want to keep your Bayesian database).

Remember to change the Incoming and Outgoing IP addresses and ports in the nospamtoday.cf file accordingly before starting the NoSpamToday! service on the new machine.

Yes, it is a good idea to backup these files.

The Bayesian database stores information for the probability analysis of emails.

You can restart with an empty database at any time, but this means you'll lose all information the Bayesian learner has accumulated so far.
