The correct answer is: 4 licenses.

NoSpamToday supports an unlimited number of domains.

It works as a transparent proxy and counts each recipient address your mail server accepts against the license (mailboxes plus aliases). It is of course possible to explicitly specify the recipients where filtering (and license counting) should be enabled and to have mails to other recipients simply passed through.

To reduce the total number of licensed recipient addresses used to a minimum, you should:

1) Configure your mail server to accept only those recipient addresses you really need and to reject all other addresses directly in the SMTP session.

or

2) Use the "Relay Settings" in the NoSpamToday Admin wizard to restrict the set of recipient addresses to those you really need. This can be configured on the third page of the SMTP proxy wizard.
